


Having an ultrasound scan








An ultrasound scan uses a special camera to look at your baby inside your tummy.

Having an ultrasound scan doesn't hurt.



Your ultrasound scan will be around 12 weeks of pregnancy.

This is to get an accurate date of when your baby is due.




The scan will be done in the hospital antenatal clinic.



A sonographer will put cold gel on your tummy.


They use a special camera to look at your baby and do some measurements.



This is what the picture looks like. Sometimes you can get a picture to take home with you.



If you are worried about anything you can ask the sonographer or midwife. You will see your midwife the same day as you have your scan.



You will be given an appointment to see your community midwife after that.
