Personal Advisor
When you are aged 16, Devon County Council will arrange for a Personal Advisor to work with you. Your Personal Advisor's job is to help you prepare for being an adult.
Your Personal Advisor will offer you the support and advice that you need to understand choices and make decisions. You can have a Personal Advisor until the age of 25.






	The Pathway Plan

	Your Home	
	Devon County Council wants to make sure you have a safe place to live. Your Personal Advisor will help you to understand your housing options.	











	You might need a 'guarantor'. This is someone who can sign documents to say that you are able to pay your rent. Your Personal Advisor can be your guarantor if it is right for you.
	<b>Living with family or friends</b> When you are 18, you might decide you want to live with family.
	You might decide you want to live with friends. Speak to your Personal Advisor if you want to live with family or friends.
	Education, Training and Employment
A Mew skills Learning for all	Devon County Council has a careers service called Step forward. Step forward can provide education and careers support and advice.







There may be some financial help available if you decide to stay in education. Your Personal Advisor can give you more information.

## Health and Well Being



Until the age of 18 you will be offered a yearly health assessment by a Children in Care nurse.



At the age of 18 you will be given a 'health passport', this is a summary of your health information.



You will be helped to register with health services such as a doctor, dentist, and optician where you are living.





SUSU SUSU SPACE	There is advice and support available to you from youth workers at Space youth service and Devon County Council's Participation team. They also organise events and groups that you can go to.
	Devon County Council may be able to help you keep or get back in contact with people who are special to you or who cared for you in the past.
	Finances (Money)
	Devon County Council will help you to
	manage your money and will support you financially, this means helping to pay for some things.

	Identification Devon County Council will pay for identification that has a photograph of you on it. This could be a passport.
	<b>Keeping in Touch</b> You could receive up to £100 to help you stay in touch with people that are important to you.
	<b>Driving Lessons</b> If you are under the age of 24, Devon County Council may pay for 10 driving lessons and your first driving test. Your Personal Advisor can tell you more about this.
	Independent Living If you are living independently you may be given money to help you buy things. This might include clothing and things for your home. Your Personal Advisor will explain what is available to you.





	Celebrations
Stappen Binthduty	Devon County Council will support you to celebrate special occasions throughout the year such as your birthday and going to care leaver events.
	Identity
	Devon County Council will support you around things that are important to your identity. This might be about your culture, sexuality, gender or religious beliefs.
	Contribution to Society
	Devon County Council will support you to be an active part of society and have your voice heard. This might be helping you to register to vote and letting you know about clubs and groups you may wish to join.
